## SC refuses to vacate stay on Franklin Templeton's e-voting

NEW DELHI: The Supreme Court on Friday ruled that all cases related to Franklin Templeton India shutting down six of its debt schemes being heard in various high courts -- Gujarat, Madras and Delhi -- will be transferred to the Karnataka High Court within two weeks. Dismissing a Special Leave Petition (SLP) by Franklin Templeton Mutual Fund against a Gujarat High Court stay order on e-voting to abruptly close six debt schemes, the apex court refused to interfere in Franklin Templeton's debt schemes wind-up case as the matter was still being heard in different high courts.
